Proposal #1 to create staggered board terms passed.

Proposal #2 to allow non-AAUW member eligibility to Board did not meet the percentage required to pass.

Proposal #3 to remove the educational requirement to AAUW membership did not meet the percentage required to pass. We are encouraged, as members, to continue to discuss these issues with each other. Often these proposals are brought forward again and being informed voters is always important!


