Virtual Auction Instructions

THANK YOU to everyone who donated items for the virtual & live auctions and brown bag gift items!

The virtual auction site http://www.32auctions.com/AAUWAppleton2021 will be open for browsing on November 24th. Bidding opens at 6:00am November 26th!

Don't be shy! It's easy to get on the site and easy to bid and rebid on the items you really want! You don't have to open an account just to browse. You DO need an account to place a bid. All it takes is your email address and a password of your choice. If you participated in last year's auction, the site will remember you & you just need to sign in.

Click once on an item for more information and to place a bid. You can click again on the photo for an enlarged view of the item. Click the X in the upper right hand corner to return to the smaller photo. When you make a bid, the auction site will confirm your bid with an email. It will also notify you if you get outbid. That's your cue to go back and BID AGAIN!

Bidding CLOSES at 10:30 PM December 1st.

Plan to stay up late to make those last-minute winning bids!

The site will tell you if you were the top bidder. You may either:




Nominating Committee Update




