I am not a great knitter, but I simply love to knit. I always have a project going and before it is even close to being finished, I am thinking about what I will tackle next. I am obsessed with buying and stashing more yarn than I will ever use... and anyone out there who also knits understands that situation. I have a magnet on the fridge my husband gave me that says I knit so I don't kill you, dear so there's that scenario too. I love the way I can look at a mitten or a sweater and realize that the whole darn thing was created one (one!) stitch at a time. I love that knitting directions look like some sort of mysterious code, but once understood are a very simple language that guides me as I create something. I love that my hands and fingers are creating in a way my mom's did and I am so grateful she taught me. I love the repetition.

There are many ways we can look at our mission in AAUW through the eyes of a knitter. Advocacy is a lengthy process that doesn't have quick results. We write letters and postcards and then wait for any sign that anyone noticed. We hear public policy refrains again and again and wonder when we will see change... voting rights, civil rights, fair pay, economic equity, fair maps, public education...and we wonder when this project will be done. When we can say: *Here you go. It's finished. Enjoy.*

We probably won't. But the work we do should be filled with patience and hope and vision, because some young granddaughter or great grandson will have a better world because of us. There will be a time that the project we are working on will be worn and every stitch of it will be appreciated because although it might have flaws, it was done with commitment and love.

Stephanie Pearl-McPhee said "You don't knit because you are patient. You are patient because you knit." Let's hang in there together with our projects, friends. Someone...someday...will wear them.

We are sad to announce the death of one of our newer members of AAUW Appleton—Susan Townsend. Our condolences go out to her family and friends.


Nominating Update

As always, you'll be notified when it is time to renew, vote or take action on other important issues.







Program Vice President Sylvia Bull introduced our speaker, Bonnie Buchanan, author of, "Words, Women and Wednesdays." Bonnie gave a very interesting talk about women and their organization from Appleton's past.

President Joan Moeschberger announced that there are scholarships being offered for NCCWSL (National Conference for College Women Student Leaders), an AAUW national program for women enrolled in a degree program. Ten scholarships will be offered by AAUW Wisconsin. NCCWSL offers the participants training in leadership and networking. The program will take place virtually May 24 through May 26.
