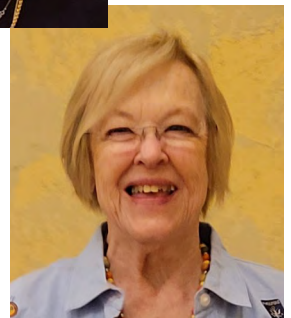

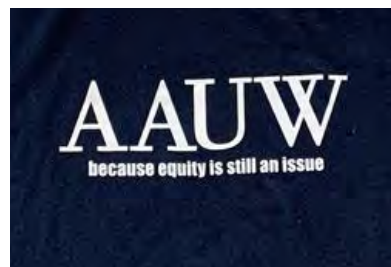

Betty Pontius In the Spotlight



When I was growing up in Milwaukee, daily my brother and I crossed the UW-Milwaukee campus on our way to grade school. My parents strongly believed that higher education is one way of becoming the person you want to be. So, from kindergarten on, I dreamed of going to a university. Another belief my parents shared was demonstrated by Mom. She worked at the voting polls, taught church school, played the piano, attended or led political events and always, yes I mean always, shared what she learned from the two newspapers we received daily. Dad worked 6 second-shift days a week at American Motors and also owned a welding shop. My older sister, brother, and I definitely learned a strong healthy work ethic from both of them. 'Do what you love and you'll do it well'.

I loved high school and all the activities involved (volleyball, basketball, badminton, and Capt. of the drill team—being honored to perform at a Packer half-time my senior year). Then came 4 years at Wisconsin State University - Oshkosh. I graduated with a degree in lower elementary education and a minor in psychology (which my husband Jim and our now-grown children sometimes "accused" me of practicing on them.) Along with the classes and socializing, as vice-president/judicial board chair of Associated Women Students (AWS), I was selected to participate in a ten person dinner honoring Betty Friedan before she spoke to the student body. I believe that was just the start to my seeking and becoming involved in organizations empowering women.

While Jim's job took us to Fullerton, CA where I taught for 3 years, my principal's wife asked me to join AAUW. Needless to say, I joined her branch. We returned to WI and I joined the Appleton Branch and paid to be a Life Member. Yes, I knew, way back then, that AAUW was, and is, on the front line of every major battle for American women's rights.

At national and regional conventions, I have heard such outstanding speakers as Gloria Steinem, Maya Angelou, Sarah Weddington, Mae Jemison, Judy Woodruff, and Associate Justice Sonia Sotomayor.

Another cherished memory is that of attending the International Federation of University Members - AAUW convention held at Stanford University in 1992. Wisconsin was paired with the Netherlands, which then hosted 20 of us in 1993, and we reciprocated in our homes in WI in 1994. Although IFUW has disbanded, many of us continue to correspond with our hosts in the Netherlands.

As state president, it was a thrill to have breakfast at the home of Al and Tipper Gore. I also enjoyed visiting many branches throughout Wisconsin and was able to come back with many great ideas to share with our Appleton branch. A continuing joy: Three state board members and I have become such dear friends that we have traveled together near and far ever since.

To quote Maya Angelou, "My mission in life is not merely to survive, but to thrive; and to do so with some passion, some compassion, some humor, and some style."

How do I thrive? By: spending time at the lake with family, camping, reading mysteries and historical fiction, working in the church garden, prepping meals for the Warming Shelter, working a puzzle or solving a Sudoku, hiking and other activities with my AZ-AAUW friends, and, of course, working at our Appleton branch's wonderful book sale year after year after fabulous year.

As a leading voice for equity for women and girls in America, it is imperative that we continue to have strong leaders in our organization. It is important for us as an organization to seek out, encourage, and support members who have the skills and the enthusiasm to fulfill these roles. (Continued next page)
