She considers Appleton her home, as it is the place where she felt, and still lauds, the sense of community that exists here. She credits many of her personal successes to the connections and growth opportunities she experienced in Appleton. She presently lives in the Seattle area, is Deputy General Counsel for Competition Law at Microsoft, and has done pro-bono work for immigrant children and domestic violence victims. Quite a product of our community!

The timing of her speech was, for me, a wonderful affirmation of the work we do in AAUW. Her reference to Melinda Gates' quote could be our theme song! Rima advises that true social progress requires us to:

-start locally -show up for the work involved -listen to each other

Oh my! I think she's talking about the work we are now doing for the Book Sale!!!

-Our months-long work is, of course, done **locally**, for the benefit of area girls and young women who earn scholarships from our proceeds.

-So many of us "**show up**" for the work involved; and by the way, the turn out for book sorting has been wonderful. "The more, the merrier" is definitely the case. AAUW Appleton & the Fox Cities Book Festival


