Fruits and berries, we thank you for your color and sweetness.

Thank you, all the animals of the world, for keeping our precious forests clean. All the trees in the world, we are thankful for the shade and warmth you give us. Thank you, all the birds in the world, for singing your beautiful songs for all to enjoy. Thank you, Grandfather Thunder Beings, for bringing rains to help all living things grow.

Elder Brother Sun, we send thanks for shining your light and warming Mother Earth. We give thanks, twinkling stars, for making the night sky so beautiful and for sprinkling morning dew drops on the plants.

And most of all, thank you, Great Spirit, for giving us these wonderful gifts."
