-Through AAUW's special consultative status with the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs and our International Fellowships program, we work to advance equity for women and girls around the world.

The Power of Women Working Together



In 2019, a coalition of Fox Valley area women's organizations gathered to plan a celebration of the centennial of the 19th Amendment. Celebrating Woman's Equality Day, August 26, (the date that commemorates the certification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution) had been a yearly event sponsored by the League since 2010. This new effort, again led by the League of Women Voters, now included a coalition of women's groups: League, AAUW, the Women's Fund, Mid-Day Women's Alliance, and the Delta Sigma Theta sorority. The collaboration of these groups brought speakers such as Michelle Duster, great-granddaughter of Ida B. Wells and Elaine Weiss, author of *The Woman's Hour* to our community. A website was developed and educational materials were offered to K-12 students. Banners displaying the history of women's suffrage were made that are still available for use and housed at the historical museum.

AAUW-Appleton was an active part of this 2-year celebration, presenting a historical reenactor of a Wisconsin suffragist and marching in the Flag Day Parade.

Fast forward to today.

The focus of celebrating women voting and gender equity continues and it was agreed that this coalition should continue as well to raise awareness and encourage actions that support this mission. Our AAUW board recently voted to continue to be a part of this group. At this time Faye Binsfeld and Becky O'Connor will represent AAUW-Appleton on this committee.

Although it is in the very early stage of planning, the following has been decided.

- Each women's group will take a turn to create a media campaign on August 26, followed by an event
 of action a month or so later.
- The Women's Fund requested the year 2023 to focus on the Status of Women in the Northeast Wisconsin. The League requested 2024 with the probable focus that election year on voter registration.
- It is likely that AAUW will choose 2025 to take the lead on the media campaign and an event of action to be determined.
- Although it is still being discussed, the name Fox Cities Women's Action Coalition is being considered for this group. Stay tuned.

We will keep you updated on this in the newsletter. In the meantime, consider supporting all women's groups when activities and programs are available. Supporting each other makes us all stronger. We are proud to be a part of this coalition.


