Spring has sprung some realizations and appreciations for me!

For example...

As we conclude April's Women's History Month, I recall my excitement while watching the NCAA Women's Basketball Finals a couple of weeks ago. "Wow," I thought, "We have made progress." There were **no** girls' sports teams in my high school experience! Yes, I am old, but not that old! I **appreciate** AAUW National for the protections of Title IX, which would not have become law without AAUW's meticulous research and grassroots political strength. The work continues.

Speaking of AAUW and equity, I only recently became aware of "Period Poverty," a concept I hadn't even imagined in my privileged life. I didn't realize that 1 in 5 girls misses school and other commitments during their menstrual cycle, as their families are unable to afford menstrual supplies. This was not on my radar screen. However, our generous Branch members responded beautifully and brought over 80 packages of menstrual products to our April Branch meeting, donating them to "The Monthlies Project" which is co-sponsored by The Women's Fund and Feeding America and provides menstrual products to schools in the Fox Valley. My appreciation for our Branch's response springs forward.

It occurs to me that some problems deserve **appreciation.** AAUW Appleton seems to have such a problem. Our amazingly successful Book Sale has made such amazing profits the last few years that we find ourselves faced with a decision regarding the use of those funds. Our present Branch Policy states that we use 50% of the profits to fund scholarships for local college girls/women. The remaining 50% funds AAUW National's Greatest Needs Fund. All that money!!! How to divvy it up, going forward!! What a great problem to have!

We'll have an opportunity to learn more about the Greatest Needs Fund and discuss the allocation of our Book Sale funds at a Special Branch Zoom meeting rescheduled for May 9th at 6:30 pm. A Zoom invitation will be sent out to all members.

Do you **realize** that our regular year of Branch meetings will draw to a close on May 18th with our "End of Year Dinner Celebration? It is a great opportunity to show our **appreciation** for the accomplishments of scholarship recipients, members who have anniversaries with our branch, and retiring and incoming officers. I'm looking forward to seeing a great turnout for this special evening.

AAUW – Appleton Financial Assistance Policy

In any given year, an active AAUW-Appleton member may need financial assistance to pay annual AAUW Membership Dues. An announcement placed in the April newsletter will state the availability of funds to assist any active member who may need help paying her annual Membership Dues. Assistance will be only for that portion of the Membership Dues that goes to National AAUW. The recipient is responsible for the State and Local portion of the Membership dues.

A member who seeks assistance shall send a note by email or mail to the Assistant VP of Membership no later than May 15 with her name and a short explanation of the circumstances of need. If any branch member is aware of a member who may need assistance, she can submit a name in the same manner. A three (3) member subcommittee of the Membership Committee will review any requests received. The subcommittee will consist of the Assistant VP of Membership plus two (2) other experienced Membership Committee members. The decision of the subcommittee is final.

All requests, submittals, and grants awarded are confidential. The Assistant VP of Membership will inform the branch Finance VP of any individual who receives the reduced dues.

It's Time to Vote in the AAUW National Election!

Sometime around April 5th you should have received your AAUW ballot. Look for the email titled "AAUW Election 2023." The email contains your Elector ID and your password. By clicking on the link directly following the ID and Password, you go straight to the ballot. Merely put in your personal Elector ID and password. That takes you straight to the ballot. Vote, then hit "continue". That will give you a final chance to confirm. Hit "confirm" and you have voted. It is that quick and easy! Do not delay, just vote now.

Three reasons you should vote: 1) It is one of the easier duties that AAUW asks of its members. Elections are necessary under AAUW Bylaws. Voting ensures it continues to function smoothly and appropriately. 2) A certain percentage of the membership must vote for there to be a valid election. We are always asking people to vote in support of our policies. This is your turn to vote. 3) It is easy.


Book Drop Off and Sorting


Chief Inspector Helene Iverson is looking for detectives to help her solve three mysteries this summer.
