It's that time of year; school is almost out! I must say, this has certainly been a year of AAUW education for me! Here's a list of just some of what I learned:

-So many Appleton AAUW members have been dedicated to the mission of AAUW for many years: *advancing equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy.* There are 100,000 members nationally inn 1000 branches. Our 110 year old branch is the oldest in the state of Wisconsin, a detail I learned at the State Convention last month.

-This year's monthly branch programs have taught me facts about practicing Civil Discourse, The National Popular Vote initiative, local World Relief efforts, and other very timely and important topics. All of these programs complement our commitment to understanding how and why we need to advance equity. As Marissa Jablonski stated in her keynote at the State Convention: "What helps females, helps everyone."

-I didn't expect to be so well instructed in pertinent Native American issues, but had the very good fortune at the State Convention to attend the AAUW Northwoods Branch's session on "The American Indian Nations of Wisconsin and Land Acknowledgment Statements." So much to learn!!! Just a small tidbit: Wisconsin is home to the largest number of Native American tribes east of the Mississippi River, encompassing 11 sovereign Tribal nations." Wow!

-Our Social Justice Group has been a "gold-mine" of learning for me. We've explored racism's effect on poverty, education, housing, and mental health. It is certainly true that "the more you know, the more you realize that you don't know." It's been quite a learning experience to share these realizations with other AAUW members in our monthly get-togethers. And, by the way, there's lots of room for newcomers!

-I have learned some impressive statistics about our commitment to advancing educational opportunities for women. For example, AAUW annually awards nearly \$6 million in post-graduate fellowships, grants and awards to outstanding women around the globe. We are all a part of that financial commitment with our fundraising efforts and personal donations.

-Thanks to a wonderful presentation from Joan Schneider via Zoom last week, I learned so much that I had to take a little nap after! Did you know: 188,000 individuals have taken AAUW's salary negotiation programs, 68,271 letters were sent to elected officials via AAUW's Two-Minute Activist program, and AAUW has had over 3.1 million impressions via media such as ABC News, New York Magazine, Philanthropy News Digest, Fortune, and Yahoo. Now, that's keeping our mission alive!

-I'm looking forward to all the learning that lies ahead. Please join me!





The Afternoon Literature group is officially on hiatus for the summer but that doesn't mean we stop reading!


