Oh yes we do!! I was reminded of that fact while listening to Laurie A. Carter, President of Lawrence University, at the Women's Fund Luncheon a couple of weeks ago. Her life long dedication to higher education leadership was a privilege to learn about at that luncheon. I was quite impressed to learn about the impact she has had on others' lives over her professional career.

However, even more impressive is that she forged on as a woman, no less a woman of color. I couldn't help but reflect on the privilege that we AAUW women have as a dedicated team impacting the lives of women and girls in our community, and through our National membership, helping women and girls across the country.

Just last year alone our branch impacted many lives via:

-Our Book Sale proceeds providing scholarships to 10 local women while also supporting National's Greatest Needs Fund to further other projects that meet our mission.

-Our membership collecting many, many personal hygiene products and diapers for refugee women in our community at our March Branch meeting.

-Our Tech Savvy workshop for 6-9th grade girls encouraging their interest in STEM careers.

-Our response to the "Period Poverty Campaign" and "The Monthlies Project" by contributing so many menstrual supplies that my car was full to the brim, delivering them for distribution to Appleton Area School District and other locations.

Those speakers at the Women's Fund luncheon also impressed me with some statistics which serves as motivation for all of us, as AAUW members, to continue our work to improve the lives of women and girls in our community, our state, and our country. I learned that "nearly two-thirds of all households in poverty in Wisconsin are headed by single women" (http:// womenscouncil.wi.gov), I was startled to learn that "only 1.9% of all U.S. charitable giving is directed specifically towards women and girls." (The Women's Philanthropy Institute). Looks like we have lots of room to exercise our "privilege of impacting other's lives!!"

Looking forward to a year full of opportunities to grab on to that privilege. Let's charge ahead!!



New book, new format, new collaboration!



We are looking forward to our upcoming AAUW Reads all branch book. We are also excited to collaborate with our AAUW-Appleton Social Justice group which is co-sponsoring this book. Although we have many book groups (afternoon and evening literature, summer mystery among them), the purpose of AAUW Reads is to unite our branch with a common book to engage our members in a new way. In the past we have read *Just Mercy, How the Word is Passed, The Woman's Hour, The Girls from Ames, I Am a Girl from Africa* and *Until I Am Free.* Our next book, *The Flag and the Cross,* explores the topic of white Christian nationalism. It is written by Philip S. Gorski and Samuel Perry. Although the book does name political candidates and leaders, our discussions will focus on the topic of what white Christian nationalism is and why it threatens democracy. From the AAUW national website: *AAUW is a non-partisan organization – but non-partisan does not mean "non-political".* Mobilizing AAUW members to work toward civil rights, voting rights, and to take action on important legislation is all part of AAUW public policy.

We are also reading and discussing this book in a new way! Stay tuned and look for more information in later newsletters, but it will be read in shorter chunks with 4 or 5 discussions offered as we go along. We will hold some winter discussions via Zoom so our winter travelers can participate...and then some in person discussions later in the year.






