We had an amazing number of branch members who worked hard to make this happen. See the statistics below shared by Becky O Connor for a re-cap of our sale!

- 632 number of messages left about picking up books on those phone numbers
- 632 number of times the book pick-up person hoped Laurie had already picked up the books
- 2548 number of books dropped off the day before the book sale
- 2548 eye rolls Donna and Shirley did when the books were dropped off the day before the book sale 78 times Betsy lied and said "We appreciate your donation" when books were dropped off the day before the book sale.







SECOND CHOICE BOOKS


