AAUW Appleton Branch Meeting Minutes November 18, 2024 6:00pm Neenah Public Library

Preceding the Meeting we had two presentations:

Helene Iverson introduced Carol Lenz and other members of Fox Cities Advocates for Public Education who talked about how our state budget is affecting K-12 schools. Special Education funding is of particular concern. The drain of funds to private schools through the Choice program continues to harm public schools. There are several ways branch members can take action as the budget is being formulated. Becky O'Connor reminded members that they received an email link to determine who their new state representatives are. Sample letters to send to representatives were made available. Public Policy is making support for public education a priority this year.

Linda Buck, STEM chair, introduced Kristine Kolb from Junior Achievement who gave a presentation about Junior Achievement's programs. Members are welcome to sign up to explore volunteering at any of the opportunities JA offers. There was a sign-up sheet available.
