President's Page

Dear Friends,

I am eagerly anticipating traveling to the Netherlands and Belgium this fall. On our free day in Amsterdam, I hope to tour the Anne Frank House. Her diary is a dramatic memory from high school reading, making me curious about the tiny attic that served as the family's hiding place from the Nazis. I had a part in our high school production of the play based on her story, which allowed me to temporarily "live" in that small space with 6 other people. The play ends with black-out and the sounds of the wooden door being chopped down. And then silence. It left a lasting wound in my heart.

I will reread Anne's diary soon; I want it to be fresh when I visit. While the conditions of Nazi Germany were far more severe than anything we have endured, I hope to take heart from the messages of hope and resilience that have made the book a lasting influence. The times we are living in beg for inspiration, even if it comes from a 13-year-old girl living in silent hiding each day to avoid detection. Despite the hate and fear the Nazi regime directed at the Jewish community, Anne wrote powerful words that can support us today.

"It's difficult in times like these: ideals, dreams and cherished hopes rise within us, only to be crushed by grim reality. It's a wonder I haven't abandoned all my ideals, they seem absurd and impractical. Yet I cling to them because I still believe, in spite of everything, that people are truly good at heart."

You can argue that statement is simplistic or naive. But when you take the time, as Anne was forced to do, and consider your neighbors, your friends, the principled leaders we respect, there is cause for reassurance. Voters may be swayed temporarily, but unfailingly the majority reject cruelty and dishonesty when they see them. Good people are at work around us.


If you contact your legislators to speak up for your values, if you have meaningful conversations with those you don't agree with, if you listen to various viewpoints, you are living what Anne spoke of with hope. We don't have to be on street corners, but we do have to be advocates for our beliefs. Our education is a gift many do not have, and with it comes the obligation to find common ground by offering points that are founded in fact and patriotism. We are the voice of knowledge and compassion.

I've selected a few more quotes from Anne instead of poetry this month. Her decision to write was a momentous one, but hardly seemed so as she began. May your decisions help shape a better community around you. Who knows where it will lead?





Our next book has been chosen! The AAUW Reads book for 2025-26 is a recommendation from the AAUW-Appleton Social Justice group. The topic is timely: immigration.

From Kirkus Reviews: A *New Yorker* staff writer examines the tragedy of Central America against the backdrop of U.S immigration policy. From the beginning, the U.S. has meddled in the affairs of Central America's nations, some of them autocracies. This tinkering, particularly in the Reagan years, led to murder, civil war, and, decades later, a stream of migrants desperate to flee rampant poverty and violence. "For more than a century, the U.S. has devised one policy after another to keep people out of the country," writes Blitzer. "For more than a century, it has failed." It's a sorrowful yet urgent topic, and Blitzer navigates it with both journalistic rigor and compassion. A sobering, well-reported history in which no one emerges a winner.

As always, AAUW Reads tackles difficult topics with heartfelt enthusiasm and courageous discussions. We hope you consider taking part in this one! We will read the book in "chunks" with a schedule that runs from November-April (no discussion in December). Two options each month will be offered...in person and on Zoom. As always...if you plan to participate...you can win this book at the September branch meeting!!





Let me be myself and then I am satisfied.


I know that I'm a woman, a woman with inward strength and plenty of courage.
