

AAUW Appleton Public Policy Update

AAUW-Appleton was invited to participate in the League of Women Voters of Appleton-Fox Cities initial convening of 22 area organizations to get to know each other's groups a bit better and begin to explore areas of potential collaboration. It was uplifting for Faye Binsfeld and me to share what is important to AAUW as well as hear about the dedicated work done by so many others in our community. Challenges we are all facing and initial ideas for potential collaborations were also discussed. AAUW National has clearly stated that collaboration with other groups is important. "The partnership (with LWV) underscores a shared belief that when women lead, democracy grows stronger. By aligning missions and mobilizing across states and communities, these organizations are demonstrating the power of collaboration in advancing equity, inclusion, and civic participation." This gathering, made up of representatives from so many groups such as NOW, ESTHER, Fair Maps Coalition, Labor Council, Wild Ones, Citizens Climate Lobby and more, was just a start. Our megaphone reaches even more people when we work together.

What makes this even more timely, is that AAUW-WI Public Policy recently alerted us to a webinar from national: **Working in Coalition: Building Power Through Partnerships.** (You can find it... search webinars on the AAUW site... and watch it when you are recovering from holiday exhaustion.)

Our branch continues to be **active and engaged!** We wrote postcards supporting the **WI ERA bill** after hearing Penny Bernard Shaber at our November branch meeting! Her encouragement to build relationships with our legislators will be our inspiration for the year. If you did not have a chance to send a postcard...here are some samples of possible texts.

"Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by this state or by any political subdivision of the state on account of sex, gender identity, race, color, sexual orientation, disability, religion, national origin, marital status, family status, age, ancestry, or any other immutable characteristic."

I am writing in support of the Wisconsin Equal Rights Amendment bill. This bill goes beyond sex. It includes a long list of other factors, but for me it starts with women. It starts with eliminating discrimination on the basis of sex.

I am asking you to support the Wisconsin Equal Rights Amendment bill. Twenty-nine states already have some type of equal rights amendment in their state constitutions and it is time for Wisconsin to also support the ERA.

The Unintended Consequence for Women Pursuing Advanced Education

The recent conversation around the definition of what is a "professional degree" has focused on what it will mean for students. What has been missing from those conversations is its impact on women.

The current discussion relates to proposed changes to student loan caps. The current caps go back to the 1965 federal law that defines a professional degree and lists 10 degrees considered professional and indicates the list is not exhaustive.

The above article recently appeared in a mailing by the Women's Fund of the Fox Valley, Inc, one of the fellow members of our Women's Action Coalition of the Fox Valley. We often mention in our AAUW meetings and information to new members that AAUW at the national level conducts research whose results are provided to law makers and policy makers. Other organizations advocating for women also rely on AAUW research reports such as the article referenced above.




2026 AAUW Appleton Branch Scholarships

We'll meet on January 6th at 1:00 pm.




